Per Commissioner Clarke's request, City Attorney Mortell provided a brief synopsis on the history of the Sailfish Ballfield property. He reported that there was a consensus to the buy-in of this project and that is why the City moved forward with an RFP. Finance Director, Joly Boglioli provided an explanation of the tax burden. It costs the City approximately \$85,000.00 to run Sailfish Ballfields.

Commissioners participated in discussion and deliberation on this Item. Mr. Mark Rodgers was asked to come forward again to explain what tournaments were played here. Mr. Rodgers explained that the fields could not be used as clay infields were desired. He explained the contributions the league has made to the ballfields over the years.

 **9:16 PM Motion:** Move that we consider the whole timing of the baseball was a good Segway I think, because at the very end of their proposal, they did mention that they would be willing to work with the City to work on the City's plan with Guy Davis and to come up with that, and I've seen the, I know what New Urban Communities is doing now across at the Triangle parcel and I've seen all of their work in other communities too but I just think that for somebody to say, if the City wants affordable or housing that will be meeting the guidelines for people who live in their communities, and for the types of jobs we have in our community, were not a New England community with a certain level of income or scenic valley where everyone makes over \$70,000.00 and so I think that for them to stick to that principal and say this is what we'd like to present you, think they can have time to change plans or bring in a type of PUD that might work better with walkability with things around the school but I think that the idea is that if we're gonna switch out the baseball fields, that we need to put something there we won't regret and will be something important. **Motion Rephrased:** If we can work with Rich Properties and work with the proposal to time out the baseball planning, that we work with them to consider doing a deal with them.

- 7) **Mark Rodgers – Two fields not going to work. Baseball has a large following and does not think people will come to the two baseball fields.**
- 8) **Betty Brinkley – Commented that she feels secure in East Stuart. Concerned that taxes will go up with redevelopment in East Stuart.**
- 9) **Susan O'Rourke – Suggested an alternate motion for the City to consider alternate properties, keeping the ballfield where it is.**
- 10) **Richard Lundy – Rich Properties – began this project 10 months ago, invited by staff to participate, submitted the proposal and has gone through the process. Concerned the proposals are not being judged on the merit of the proposal.**
- 11) **David Higgins – Requested the Commission hold Sailfish Park to the same importance of Memorial Park.**
- 12) **Commented on the advantages of having a new hotel and 300 more residents who can spend their money downtown could help. Four ballfields may be able to fit at Guy Davis.**
- 13) **Tom McNicholas – City resident – Agrees that affordable housing is needed in Stuart but suggested the commission wait another 60 days and possible ask residents if they would help fund the parks.**

Mayor Glass Leighton commented that the City did try and increase the sales tax with the County and it failed.


