#### 5. PALM CITY ROAD IMPROVEMENTS:

RESOLUTION No. 22-2019; A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENT No. 4 AND CIP AMENDMENT No. 2 TO THE 2018-2019 GENERAL FUND AND CAPITAL

Commissioner Matheson requested an update and time frame from City Engineer and Assistant Public Works Director, Tim Voelker.

Tim Voelker commented on the Palm City Road completion of construction at 8 to 10 months. Waiting on the Martin County Right-of-Way Permit.

Commissioner Meier commented on the 60% increase in this project and asked if there was an estimate in a cheaper option of fixing up the existing poles.

Voelker responded that though he does not have that estimate, possibly half, or more than half the project amount. There are ways to bid this project out and possibly use internal resources.

Meier commented that flashing lights do not work and requested input from the Board on going forward with the initial recommendation of raised crosswalks with existing flashing lights as they were. Matheson commented that the lights would be motion activated and feels public safety is worth it.

#### **Public Comment:**

1) Jim Coallegos - Manor Drive; In support of the pedestrian activated lights.

Commissioner Meier requested research data on the efficacy of pedestrian activated lights at a crosswalk, always on flashing lights and no flashing lights.

Voelker will check into the data available.

6 7 People Sworn – Kevin Freeman, Stephen Mayer of City of Stuart, Bob Raynes of Gunster Florida Law, Richard Geisinger of Stuart Acquisition Realty, Joe Capra of Captec, and Bob Britt of Britt Architects, and Greg Boggs of Lucido and Associates.

Stephen Mayer, Senior Planner gave a brief presentation on the Northpoint Major Urban Conditional Use. This Resolution is a one adoption hearing because it is a major urban conditional use within the urban district of our code. In a PUD, there is a first and second reading, in the conditional use, there is one Community Redevelopment Board (CRB) Meeting and one City Commission Meeting. The applicant is the North Stuart Acquisition and Development, LLC. Mayer noted corrections to the staff report: 1) office building is 27,300 square feet and 2) garage has 28 parking spaces.

Mr. Bob Raynes noted a correction on #13 in Staff Recommendations – there is a reference to the "association", should read the "property owner".

Mr. Richard Geisinger, presented the North Point Development Plan. Discussion of time frame included the developer having a CO by December 31, 2023; the developer would be responsible for the TIFF money on the balance of the CO not completed. The Boardwalk will be part of the developers plan. If there is a possibility of getting a FIND Grant, they would pursue that by providing an easement to the municipality. Continuation discussion for various project conditions.

## **Project Conditions:**

- · TIFF Penalty and Credit
- Boardwalk completion date
- FDOT Parking open for public, day parking only not overnight
- Number of docks used for the restaurant
- Security deposit related to the demolition if the project is not complete or to restore the project to its original condition.
- · 8 foot sidewalk on exterior of the project
- Clear timeframe for CO.

Commissioner Matheson expressed concern on one of the crosswalks.

Kevin Freeman requested conformation for staff on the request for eight (8) variances.

#### **Public Comment:**

- Armond Pasquale Commented that the City does not need additional commercial properties sold to developers, would like to see more recreational purposes.
- 2) Helen McBride Flamingo Avenue; In support of the project.

7:49 PM Motion: To continue the project to allow the applicant to work with staff to come up with a clear time frame in writing for the CO. The CO would be issued only after the completion of the entire project, including the limitations set forth here tonight. This would include a penalty if the applicant paying the estimated TIFF generated, if the time frame is not met before the CO is issued and to be specific, the CO, before the CO would be issued would be the entire boardwalk whether you do the small triangle piece in a Phase II or not, but the CO would be issued after all the boardwalk is done, after all the parking spaces are completed, and that those parking spaces would be used for public use, no boat trailer storage, no RV's. It the time frame is not met, the re-up bonus would not be applicable in this project.
