RESOLUTION No. 16-2019; A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA, GRANTING A CONDITIONAL USE APPROVAL TO NORTH STUART ACQUISITION AND DEVELOPMENT, LLC, OWNER OF PROPERTY LOCATED BETWEEN OLD DIXIE HIGHWAY AND THE FEC RAILROAD, NORTH OF THE ST. 


