City Attorney clarified for the record, all that is before the Commission is land annexation, that parcel would be declared in the City of Stuart. The zoning that remains on the land is the same as it is zoned in Martin County currently. In the event the developer wants to pursue a site plan, they would need to file a petition with the City for a land use change, go before the Land Planning Agency Board, two Commission meetings for approval and notice to all within 300 feet of the property. The sole issue before the Commission with this Ordinance is the annexation of property itself.
