Dyess reviewed the Resolution, stating this is the Wells Fargo property purchase and is not a tax-funded repayment, but coming from the City's property management fund. He recommends the Commission's approval with the plan to eventually move City Hall to that location.

Six (6) people sworn; Kevin Freeman and Tom Reetz, City of Stuart, Michael Houston of HJA Design Studio, Terry McCarthy of McCarthy Summers, Shawn MacKenzie, Traffic Engineer, and Howard Ehrsam of Bowman Consulting,

Tom Reetz, Senior Planner briefly reviewed the letters received from Martin County, Traffic Engineer, Civil Engineer, and the DEO and presented the updates.

Michael Houston presented a review of the project.

Terry McCarthy introduced proof of the notices to surrounding properties. (Provided to the City Clerk)

Shawn MacKenzie came forward to review the traffic ingress and egress.

Howard Ehrsham came forward to confirm the phased on-site stormwater retention plan.

Public Comment:

1) Janet Henrich - Natalie Estates resident; opposes project and feels the 4sorties will be an eyesore, the stormwater drainage has not been properly addressed as they still have flooding, has concerns about the traffic on US1 and additional crowding in schools.

 Connie Dodson – Natalie Estates resident; opposes the location of this project, no buffer zone to their property. Feels its too many people and does not fit in with the surrounding area.

3) Deborah Platt – Natalie Estate resident; opposes the project, concerned about exiting to head northbound/increased traffic and feels it doesn't fit in area.

4) Jessica Roberts – on behalf of grandfather who lives in Natalie Estates; opposes project and questions on the notification process, recommended that this is postponed until more residents are in town and available for comment.

5) Susan Bowman – ZOOM; Commented that there was no posting for this meeting on a board and does not appreciate a motion before public comment; opposes the project, commented on the traffic study, compatibility, water saturation, and voting at the polls.

For clarification, Mayor Meier noted that occasionally public comment is called before a motion I made, but during standard meeting procedures, public comment is heard after a motion is made and seconded.

6) Helen McBride – Flamingo Avenue; As a City resident, in favor of the project, feels it is a needed addition for families and senior citizens.

Brief discussion to clarify remaining questions on the Springtree Project.
