Stephen Mayer, Senior Planner, presented the Conditional Use location, future land use, waiver's requested for density. The Code allows 15 units per acre per acre, the applicant is requesting 14 units on a .58-acre site which equates to 24 units per acre. The Commission may review development up to 30 units per acre as a Conditional Use approval. Mayer explained the quality expectations of the City, parking, site plan, elevations, and that public art will be decided in the future. Staff recommendations of the Community Redevelopment Board (CRB) have been included and this project is recommended for approval by staff.

David Peters, Public Works Director came forward to answer questions about exfiltration issues. He agreed that the applicant should include the maintenance plan and allow the City the authority to review and manage the exfiltration.

Tyler Adams, Greenlight Real Estate Development and Design provided a video presentation on the Osceola Street project.

Joe Capra, Captec Engineering, provided an overview of the exfiltration system, maintenance plan, permits and reporting.

Mayor Meier encouraged the applicants to plant mangroves, native plants, or living shoreline material in or around the seawall for the long-term viability of the project.
