# 3.CARES ACT PRESENTATION

Carol Houwaart-Diez from United Way of Martin County presented an overview of the Cares Act Funding. She mentioned \$1.75 Million Dollars would go toward rent, mortgage and utility assistance as well as \$3.2 Million for food applications. The funds will expire December 30, 2020. She noted the United Way was working closely with the Salvation Army and House of Hope with hopes of partnering with the City.

Dan Hudson provided information on the Cares Act for Business Funding Program stated they are open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Palm City Library and businesses may qualify for reimbursement grants up to \$20K, aimed at for-profit organizations and listed the requirements as being an ongoing viable business. There is \$5.6M available; eligibility requirements apply and the following types of expenses that can be reimbursed are wages, inventory, rents/mortgages, utilities, and other COVID-19 related expenses. Kevin Freeman, Development Director provided a presentation on the PUD Amenity Criteria.

A brief discussion took place on the topics of the criteria, point system and point allocation distribution.

Commissioner Matheson shared his recommendations for additions to the program. He suggested adding language to add the bus facility item like the tree fund. He offered suggestions, increased storm water retention above what the district would require and increased water quality improvement projects.

Juan G. Fernandez of A.H.S Residential, LLC, informed Commission they were able to increase the units to 20 for the 10 years at 80% AMI.

Bill Mathers provided a brief overview of fire hydrant locations and design. He mentioned the Fire Marshall had reviewed the current fire hydrant design and it had been approved.

City Attorney Mike Mortell provided information on the State of Florida, Martin County and the City of Stuart's adopted State of Emergency's related the COVID-19 Pandemic. They all strongly encouraged wearing the masks, but it was not required.
