6. ALTERNATIVE WATER SUPPLY UPDATE

Tim Voelker, Utilities & Engineering Director presented the components of the Alternative Water Supply Project, reviewing each component to include the Floridan Aquifer Well FA-1, the Reverse Osmosis Facility Design, which will be implemented in phases. This is the most expensive component with 100% of the design complete. Each component has its own contractor for cost efficiency and specialized components. The concrete pipeline design was displayed on the map showing it going through the East Stuart Community. It will be done with direction drilling, so minimal digging will be done. The Deep Injection Well Modification Design component was discussed. Voelker reviewed the project construction costs for 3 of the phases to total 19.7 million and explained funding received and utilized. Potential future funding was described and explained what the Commission would see at upcoming meeting.

Commissioners asked questions about funding, the deep injection well and drilling process and comparisons, and ASR Wells.

Commissioner Meier suggested exploring all grant opportunities to help offset construction costs and phasing the project.

4:49 PM 7. PRESENTATION BY AGUACULTURE ON MECHANICAL REMOVAL OF AQUATIC VEGETATION ON LAKE OKEECHOBEE

Mike Elfenbein, a conservationist from AquaCulture, supported mechanical harvesting and announced the FWC & DEP recently awarded a \$500,000 grant to remove nutrients from Lake Okeechobee. Requesting to solicit the support of the City in recognition of their project, introduced co-owner of AguaCulture Mr. Nick Saboe.

Nick Saboe presented a PowerPoint on the company's history, their process, land application, explaining how their design works.

Commissioners participated in a question and answer session, discussing the effect on animals, surface water, and the timeline to remove the vegetation.

Mayor Clarke opened public comment.
