COMMENTS BY CITY COMMISSIONERS

Commissioner McDonald

- Commented on the success of the City of Stuart Job Fair.

Commissioner Meier

- Reported on comments received by residents on the 5th Street, Stypmann, and High School Avenue area about alleyways. He reviewed the Code on maintaining alleyways and would like to see a vision be brought back by Pinal Gandhi-Savdas and Kev Freeman, perhaps before the CRB to review a vision of alleyways and what to do with them.
- Commented on public transit, the use of the Marty bus and its lack of shelter/benches and would like that to be brought up at the next MPO meeting. Interested in seeing the same for the City tram stops.
- Interested in continuing the conversation on scooters, e-bikes or bike shares, CRA involvement and look at putting out and RFP or RFQ; would like to encourage this.
- Commented on the parking issues pertaining to the Sailfish Marina project and looks forward to future discussions on parking permitted underneath buildings as a code allowance.
- Reported that he met with the owner of Hudsons on the River restaurant and noted his concerns on some decisions that are allowable at staff level.

Brief discussion between him and Attorney Mike Mortell determined that instead of a policy change, they would address concerns as they come up. Meier agreed and would like it to be brought forward with a presentation or site plan proposal on putting the deck in the park and its access.


Vice Mayor Matheson

- Commented in agreement with Commissioner Meier on transportation stops.
- Announced upcoming events such as a Rally to Save the Manatees at the Ernie Lyons Bridge on May 1st at 10 a.m. and the AACES Junk in the Trunk Sale at the East 10th St. Community Center on May 15th.
- Thanked participants of the Job Fair, had over 167 potential employees visit, 21 of 22 employers come, and 2 community partner help with the event. Announced for people to contact him or the Business Development Board if they are in need of a job.
- Commented on the order of presentation of projects by the staff and applicants and how it has reverted to staff presenting first. Feels the applicant should make the presentation and staff is there for commissioner questions and follow-up.
- Provided a Lake Okeechobee update, noting that the C-24 canal reservoir should be coming online in August.

Mayor Clarke

- Reported on the prayer vigil at Gazebo Park held on April 19th and thanked the Stuart Police Dept and Police Chief for their participation and all they do to protect the citizens of Stuart.

- Announced on April 30th, CRA will have a tour and dedication of the crosswalks in East Stuart.
- Inquired about the fenced in area at the end of 14th Street near YMCA.
- Commented on Mental Health Awareness Month and asked that we all work to help each other.

- Requested clarification from Mayor Clarke on 14th Street, asking if she was interested in a pocket park or a crossover to Monterey Rd. She replied “both”.
- Commented on a motion at the last meeting pertaining to the permanent closure of Bryant Avenue. The Fire Department has informed him that the road is a limited access road and if closed, a turn-around access would be needed on Bryant heading east, therefore, it is not feasible to close it for Fire Rescue reasons.
- Reported that staff has been meeting and working on alleyways and they need to be addressed section by section as each neighborhood has its own particular issues.
- The Marty transportation system: currently the City stops do not have right of way to put in seating or structure.
- Noted on the scooter survey that was done and received a clear no on the topic unless further direction from the Commission is received.

8. PALMETTO COVE RPUD - REZONING TO RPUD (QUASI-JUDICIAL):

ORDINANCE No: 2463-2021: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA, REZONING TWO PARCELS ON EITHER SIDE OF A 11' PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY (ALLEY) ALONG SW PALM CITY ROAD, ON THE SOUTHWEST INTERSECTION OF SW HALPATIOKEE STREET, TOTALING 0.97 ACRES FROM RESIDENTIAL MULTIFAMILY/OFFICE (R-3) TO RESIDENTIAL PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT (RPUD); ESTABLISHING THE "PALMETTO COVE" RPUD CONSISTING OF THIRTEEN (13) MULTIFAMILY UNITS WITHIN TWO (2) INDIVIDUAL TWO-STORY TOWNHOME BUILDINGS; WITH SAID LANDS BEING MORE FULLY DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED; APPROVING A DEVELOPMENT SITE PLAN; PROVIDING FOR DEVELOPMENT CONDITIONS AND A TIMETABLE FOR DEVELOPMENT; DECLARING THE PLAN TO BE CONSISTENT WITH THE CITY'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN; PROVIDING DIRECTIONS TO THE CITY CLERK; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.


Six (6) sworn; Tom Reetz and Kev Freeman of City of Stuart, Mike Faulkner, Owner of Southern Landmark Homes, Scott Montgomery, Engineer, Jeff Smith, Creative Landscaping, and Dan Braden, Dan Braden Architects.
