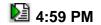
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4. STUART FIRE RESCUE 2021 ANNUAL REPORT

Nathaniel (Dan) Holt, Engineer – Sworn in and spoke on pervious pavement, 30 parking spaces, month to month lease.

Rob Gluckman, Manager of Monterey Medical, sworn in and explained the incentives for staff parking. Complimented the developer/landlord in working with them.

- 2) Linda Kay Richards Commented that it is a dangerous president, opposes the project and covering up green space.

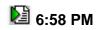
Commissioners deliberated. City Attorney provided background on the site stating that this project falls within the Code's guidelines.

MOTION AMENDED 6:54 PM: [Meier] Incorporate in stormwater infrastructure, a nutrient reduction technology or system above and beyond the agreed upon by staff; the nutrient reduction targets for this stormwater system are in terms of nitrogen and phosphorus are comparable to dried retention, to the existing retention areas, that at least will have biological functional, that whatever technology they choose has the similar nutrient reduction technology value. – Off-site parking in perpetuity, 5 or 10 years (number of years not determined).
